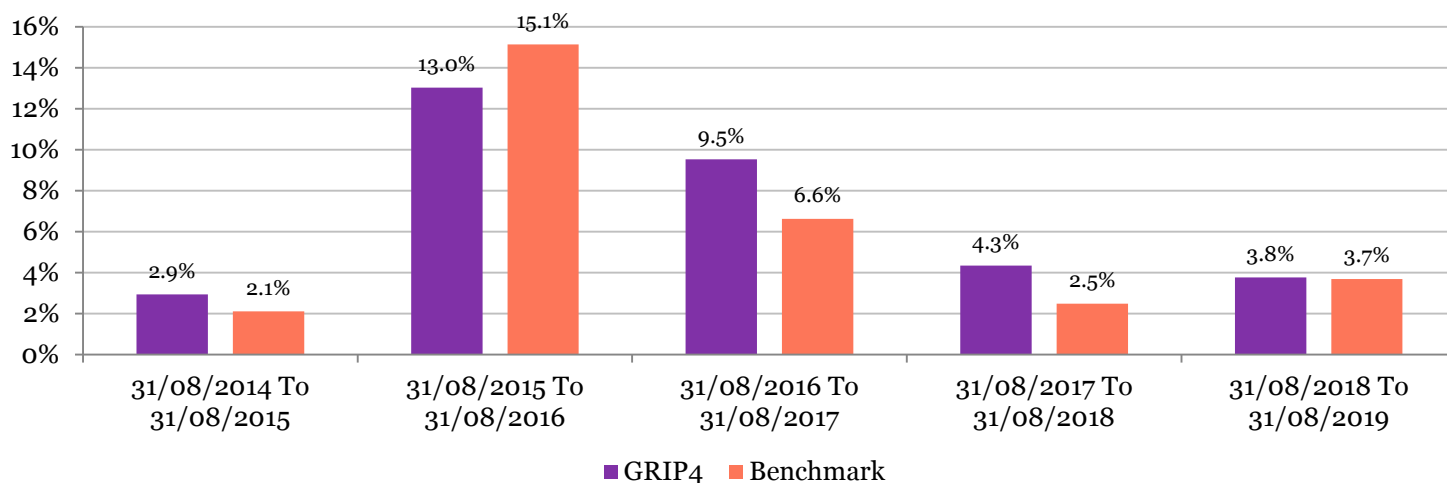

The past 5 years:

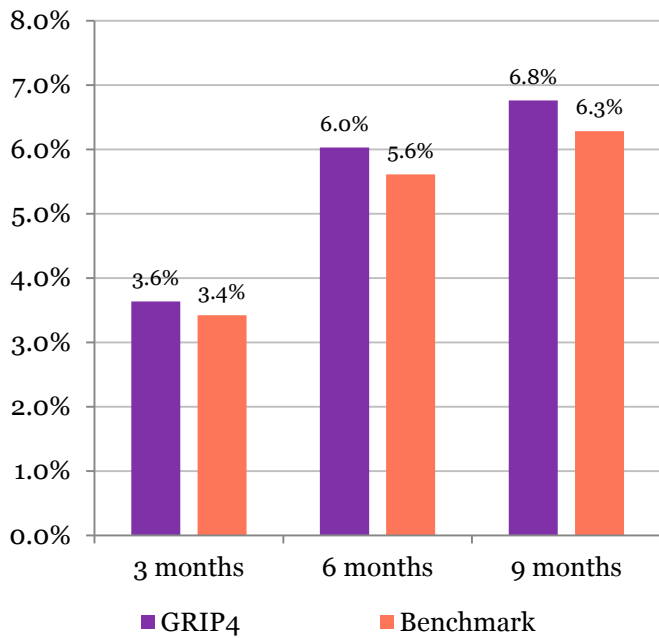

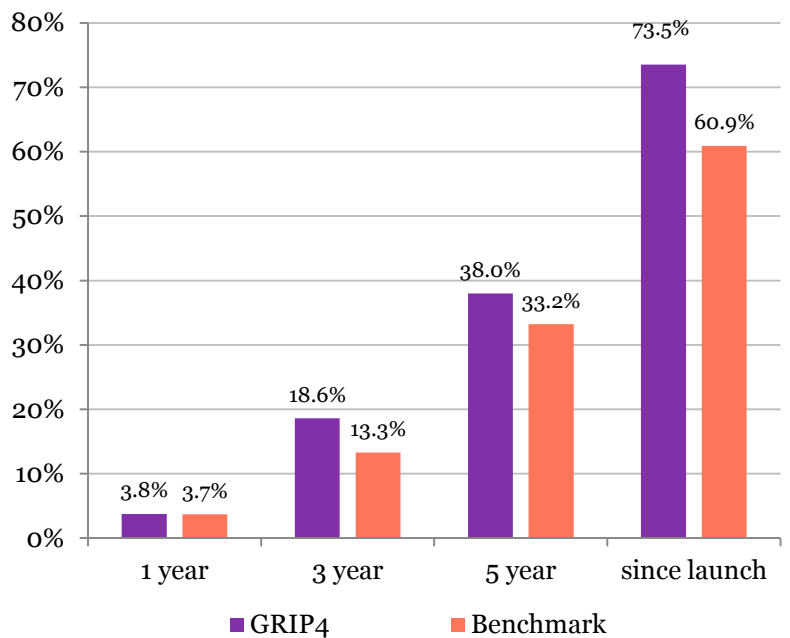

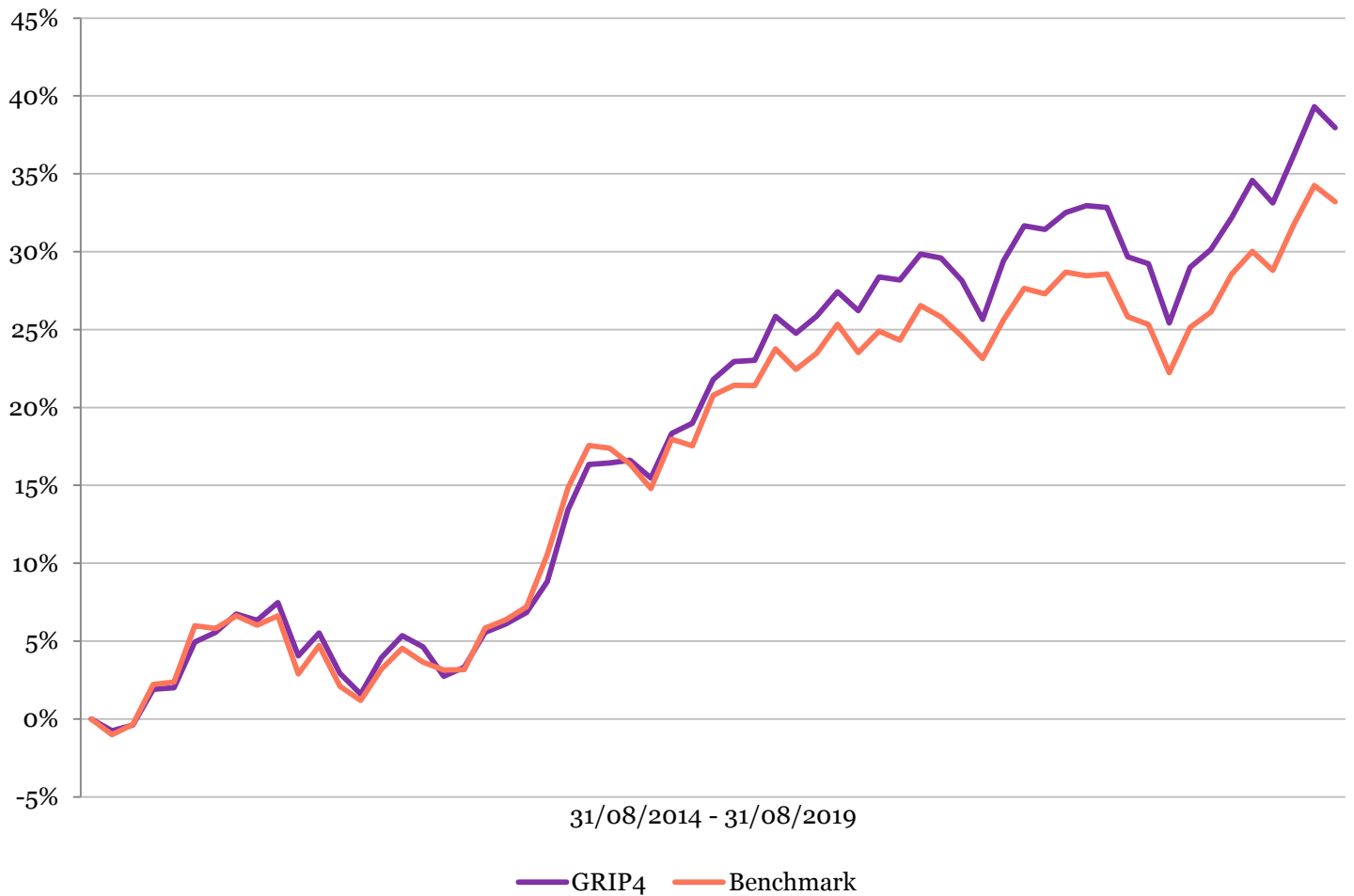
Shorter term:

PORTFOLIO GOVERNANCE

Our Governed Retirement Income Portfolios have a formal review process and are monitored by the Investment Advisory Committee (IAC). The IAC consists of pension and investment experts and is headed up by an independent chairperson, to ensure that decisions remain impartial. The IAC meets regularly, usually on a quarterly basis, to review our full investment proposition. The IAC process is deliberately about taking a long-term view to ensure that investment decisions are based on sound fundamentals.

LAST 3 TACTICAL CHANGES:

15th August 2019

Global equities rose for the sixth month this year in July as the Federal Reserve cut US interest rates in response to slowing growth. While the US-China trade talks showed few signs of progress, investors remained hopeful of a resolution. Given muted inflation, we expect monetary easing by central banks to trigger a mini cyclical upswing. We have taken advantage of short-term market weakness to move more overweight in equities, increasing our underweight in commodities; and, as bond yields declined to new lows, have reduced our holdings of government, corporate and global high yield bonds.

11th July 2019

Stock markets rebounded in June as investor sentiment recovered due to the Federal Reserve signalling it would likely cut rates in July. Trade tensions also appeared to ease as there were positive signals about a US deal with China. Despite ongoing political uncertainty and slower global growth, risk of global recession in 2020 has arguably reduced as policymakers signalled easier policies. We have moved more overweight in equities and short duration global high yield bonds, and reduced our underweight in commodities funded out of cash based strategies.

13th June 2019

Global stock markets retrenched in May as President Trump reignited trade wars with China, having imposed tariffs on specific imports from China, and they retaliated; hopes of a US-China trade deal reduced. Economic data deteriorated slightly and antitrust scrutiny weighed on technology stocks. Central banks are concerned about trade tensions and are closer to cutting interest rates, which should boost investor sentiment. We have moved overweight in UK government bonds, given weaker inflation expectations, and retain a moderate overweight in equities, given positive global growth persisting; while reducing exposure to cash, and commodities which are sensitive to global trade slowing.
